



BOUNDARY REVIEW TASK FORCE MEETING #3

Date: October 16, 2018

Location: Career and Technical Education Center (CTEC) from 6 – 8 p.m.

Introductions

Michael Wolfe from the District welcomed the group and set the agenda for the meeting. Mike also introduced Superintendent Christy Perry, who briefly spoke to the Task Force and thanked them for their involvement.

Recap of Previous Meeting

Michael Wolfe proceeded to provide a summary of last week's meeting, including revisiting the following introductory agenda items:

- The Superintendent's charge to the Task Force was reviewed, including the guiding principles and equity focus.
- The Task Force was reminded of the consensus decision making approach that will be used to evaluate and approve updates to the Springboard Proposal.
- The Task Force was reminded to review the parent survey, as it provides valuable feedback to the Task Force from the community and the survey is statistically valid.
- The Task Force meeting structure was reviewed, including the assigned subgroups. The Task Force was reminded to reach consensus within their respective groups and to work with neighboring feeder systems as needed, to confirm consensus is reached.

Special Education Program (SPED)

Student Services Director Eric Richards spoke to the Task Force regarding proposed changes to the existing SPED program locations. Eric explained that the boundary update process has provided the District with the opportunity to better align SPED program locations to the high school feeder systems, allowing neighborhood students to stay closer to their homes. Currently, SPED programs are not situated by high school feeders, requiring students to leave their current feeder system to attend

Assigned Breakout Groups

Task force members were broken out into the same three groups as the previous week to begin reviewing, in detail, the Springboard Proposal and to begin discussing possible improvements.

Additional District staff were identified as floaters to interact with all three groups. The three breakout groups were arranged by pairing feeder systems as follows:

- Group 1: West and McNary
- Group 2: McKay and North
- Group 3: South and Sprague

Group Discussion

For the final twenty minutes of the evening, the Task Force was brought back together for two recommendations by the McKay and North group and for sharing general observations on the breakout groups and scenarios.

- The McKay and North recommendations brought forward to the Task Force for consideration are as follows:
 - The first recommendation is to change HS feeders for Hallman ES and Swegle ES from the existing springboard proposal, so that Hallman ES will now attend North HS and Swegle ES with attend McKay HS. The recommendation is based upon the proximity of the Swegle ES neighborhood to McKay HS.
 - The second recommendation is to extend the Cesar Chavez ES springboard proposal boundary north to include the Lamb ES springboard proposal attendance area east of Cordon Road NE. The recommendation is based upon Lamb ES currently being overcapacity and the springboard proposal not sufficiently remedying this.

The Task Force reached consensus on both recommendations, resulting in the first updates to the springboard proposal. The new proposal going forward will be referred to as **Task Force Proposal 1**.

Task Force Proposal 1 will also include several minor boundary adjustments that were recommended by the District transportation department after the task force meeting. The adjustments involved a review of property boundaries along attendance area boundaries.
