



BOUNDARY REVIEW TASK FORCE MEETING #6

Date: November 13, 2018

Location: Career and Technical Education Center (CTEC) from 6 – 8 p.m.

Introductions

Michael Wolfe from the District welcomed the group and set the agenda for the meeting, which included feedback from the student equity committee, revised task force numbers, and community engagement, to be followed by the Task Force gathering into their workgroups.

Student Equity Committee

Michael Wolfe presented feedback from the student equity committee. Items of importance to the committee include student diversity, minimizing splits, equitable access to programs, more affordable housing, refugee welcoming centers, and better food.

Revised Task Force Numbers

The District took into consideration feedback received from the Task Force the previous week related to charter schools, free and reduced lunch, and English language learners. FLO Analytics reviewed the student information system data to get a better sense of student movement from school to school and updated the data with resources provided by the District from Food Services and the Synergy Data Team in Technology and Information Services. Revised numbers and additional supplemental materials were provided to the Task Force.

Community Outreach

In response to feedback from the first Open House event, the District announced a change to the community outreach strategy to include targeted outreach to affected school communities, presentations specific to the audience, and childcare.

Assigned Breakout Groups

Task Force members were broken out into the same three groups as the previous week to continue work from the previous week's meeting. District staff worked as floaters to interact with all three groups. The three breakout groups were arranged by pairing feeder systems as follows:

- Group 1: West and McNary
- Group 2: McKay and North
- Group 3: South and Sprague

Group Discussion

For the final fifteen minutes of the evening, David Hughes brought the Task Force back together for recommendations presented by all three working groups.

- The West and McNary recommendations brought forward to the Task Force for consideration are as follows:
 - Area east of River Road, west of Cherry Ave NE, and south of Plymouth Dr NE moved to Cummings ES.
 - Area south of Lockhaven Dr NE & west of Verda Ln NE & Lawnview St NE moved into Keizer ES.
 - Middle school boundaries were aligned to match the proposed elementary changes
- The North Salem and McKay recommendations brought forward to the Task Force for consideration are as follows:
 - Rural area in Cesar Chavez ES, south of Swegle Rd NE extended east to include the area near Cottonwood Street NE and 63rd Ave NE, out to the District's eastern boundary moved to Auburn ES.
 - The area in Haysville ES north of Hayesville Dr NE and east of Lancaster Dr NE moved to Hammond ES.
 - Cascade View Apartments area moved from Hayesville ES to Cesar Chavez ES.
 - Area in Hayesville ES, south of Ward Dr NE, off Fisher Rd NE (does not include the Cascade View Apartments) moved to Yoshikai ES.
 - Area off Cooley Dr NE and 39th Ave NE, as well as the properties off Santiam Pass Way NE (west of Lancaster Dr NE) moved from Yoshikai ES to Cesar Chavez ES.
 - Middle and High school boundaries were aligned to match the proposed elementary changes
- The South Salem and Sprague recommendations brought forward to the Task Force for consideration are as follows:
 - The area in Salem Heights ES south of Madrona Ave, in Task Force Proposal 2 was moved back to Candalaria ES.

Upcoming Task Force Committee Meeting #7

The Task Force shared concerns about the ability to attend a working meeting on November 20 due to parent-teacher conferences. The Task Force also discussed holding a longer meeting on November 27, instead of holding a meeting on November 20. The Task Force showed consensus around Tuesday December 4 as the date for the next public engagement events.
