Salem Keizer Public Schools – Indian Education Program

Family Nights: These events will include cultural arts such as dance and crafting, fun support activities for science, math, and literacy, and study hall support for all students who wish to take part. These events are designed for full family participation. A light dinner is provided at 6:00 p.m., and activities are held from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. There is something for everyone!

Fall Family Nights are at Bush Elementary School, 410 14th St. SE, Salem OR 97301

Thursday Nights: October 18th and 25th, and November 1st and 8th

Winter Family Nights are at Harritt Elementary School, 2112 Linwood St NW, Salem OR 97304

Thursday Nights: February 7th and 21st, and March 7th

Spring Family Nights are at Weddle Elementary School, 1825 Alder Dr. NE, Salem OR 97303

Thursday Nights: April 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th, and May 2nd and 9th

Tutoring/Study Hall: Starting in October, study hall is available on every Tuesday in partnership with the Siletz area office, located at 3160 Blossom Dr. NE, Salem OR 97305 from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Study Hall will also be held on all Thursdays for which activities are scheduled, as noted above. A secondary math teacher and additional tutors are available to help with homework questions. This is an excellent time to get extra one-on-one help.

Summer School: Summer School is a three-week program for students in grades 1st through 8th. Language arts, math and cultural arts are taught through a Native based social studies theme. One or more field trips support the curriculum content.

Representation at School Meetings: Parents can invite Indian Education staff to attend school meetings such as IEP or behavioral meetings.

Parent Advisory Committee: The Indian Education Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) is a very important part of the Indian Education Program. Parents meet to discuss services for students, plan activities to support special events such as the Eagle Feather Graduation Celebration, and approve the annual federal grant application.

Eagle Feather Graduation Celebration: In May of each year, all Indian Education students who complete high school and earn either a diploma or GED are honored at a Native based celebration. The celebration includes a color guard, a drum, gifting of graduates, and a reception.

Program services are held at multiple locations throughout the district.
