



## Update on Bond-Funded Construction at Miller



Construction improvements funded by the 2018 bond are on schedule to start at Miller during Spring Break!

Our project management team at the district's Construction Services Department has been working hard to finalize plans, hire a contractor, and plan the schedule and phases of construction work.

Part of this organizational work is making adjustments to school operations during construction. Adaptations to our normal routines such as creating new walk paths around construction are important for enhancing safety. The safety of students, staff and visitors is the top priority during construction.

Soon we'll see contractors start staging activities like setting up construction fencing and temporary portables as office space on site. Only authorized personnel are allowed inside the construction zone – **Students, staff and visitors may not go inside the fenced areas.**

Construction at Miller is planned to be substantially complete by the end of December 2020. This means our school will be under construction this summer and through part of next school year.

During the summer, the campus will be closed to staff, students and visitors. For safety, the entire campus will be considered a hard hat zone and only construction crews will be allowed on site. Our school office will be relocated to Four Corners Elementary School for normal summer hours. We'll have more information for you as we get closer to summer.

To kick off the start of construction, we are planning a groundbreaking celebration event on March 17, 2020. Stay tuned to our website and newsletters for more information about the event coming soon!

When construction is complete, Miller will have and five new classrooms, two additional restrooms, a secured vestibule at the front entry, an updated electronic badge access system, and many other improvements!
