

# Bond construction update

## McKinley Elementary School

### April 2021

Voters passed a bond measure in 2018 to fund improvements for Salem-Keizer Public Schools. The bond will support some level of improvement at every school in the district. McKinley Elementary School will receive more than \$2 million in renovations to support music, increase safety and security and protect the public's investment in the school building.

#### Highlights of work happening at McKinley include:

- Music room improvements, including heating/ventilation improvements and new shelving
- Plumbing improvements
- Library improvements, including new bookshelves and improvements to the circulation area
- Seismic strengthening in more areas of the school
- Expand office staff's view of the courtyard and front door for increased monitoring and control
- Expanded wireless capacity
- Intercom system upgrades

BRIC Architecture and the district project management team are finished with the design process and have created instructions for Andy Medcalf, the construction contractor for McKinley's bond project, to use to improve the spaces at our school.

Construction is scheduled to begin this summer. As the time for construction approaches, you may notice staging activities for construction taking shape on campus, such as fencing or temporary traffic flow adjustments. Construction is expected to be substantially complete early in the fall of 2021.

Thanks to the community's support of the bond, McKinley will soon have improvements to support a safer learning environment.
