

At school and under construction

Important information for Myers parents

Welcome back to school! Construction at Myers began in the summer and is expected to be complete early in the fall of 2022.

Myers will be an active construction site during the school year. Myers can operate safely while under construction because of careful planning and expert project management by the district and construction teams.

Safety is the top priority for students, staff, parents and visitors while the building is under construction. The contractor has set up fences around campus to help keep everyone safe.

Here is some important information to keep in mind during construction:

- Obey all signs and stay out of the construction zones!
- Don't distract construction workers – allow workers to focus on their jobs to help keep themselves and others safe.
- Please use extra caution when walking, biking or driving near the school and watch for construction vehicles.
- Renovations inside the front entry will be complete within just a few weeks. A temporary plywood transaction window will be used until work on the new transaction window is finished. Temporary walls and signage inside the building will block exits leading outside into the construction zone.

Construction can cause some temporary disruptions, but the improved learning spaces for students are an important investment and the results will soon outweigh the inconvenience.
