



Auburn Elementary School Bond Construction Update!

May 2020



Construction season is gearing up in Salem Keizer School District. Many schools are currently under construction, including Auburn, and a total of 20 schools are expected to be under construction within the next couple of months. Just over \$21.6 million is being invested in expansions and improvements at Auburn, thanks to the bond that voters passed in 2018.

While schools are currently closed and many businesses are in different stages of reopening because of the coronavirus pandemic, the governor’s “Stay Home, Save Lives” order allows construction businesses to operate provided they implement social distancing policies. Our construction contractors are fully informed about the requirements of social distancing.

Highlights of the work happening at Auburn include 11 new classrooms, a new cafeteria, serverly and kitchen, a new multipurpose fitness room, a relocated front office for better vision of the main entry, removal of all portable classrooms, additional parking and much more. The improvements for our school will be amazing!

Construction began in May and is expected to be completed early in the fall of 2021. Our campus is closed to visitors – Please do not enter fenced areas and obey all posted signs.

Auburn’s office will be relocated to Chávez Elementary School during the summer. Campuses will remain closed, and the schedule for staffing the school office will vary during the summer. Please contact Auburn’s office at 503-399-3128 for information about summer office hours.
