



## Scott Elementary School Bond Construction Update!

May 2020



Construction season is gearing up in Salem Keizer School District. Many schools are currently under construction, and a total of 20 schools are expected to be under construction within the next couple of months, including Scott. Just over \$10.2 million is being invested in expansions and improvements at Scott, thanks to the bond that voters passed in 2018.

While schools are currently closed and many businesses are in different stages of reopening because of the coronavirus pandemic, the governor's "Stay Home, Save Lives" order allows construction businesses to operate provided they implement social distancing policies. Our construction contractors are fully informed about the requirements of social distancing.

Highlights of the work happening at Scott include ten new classrooms, a new cafeteria and kitchen, a new multipurpose fitness room, a secure vestibule at the front entrance, removal of all portable classrooms, heating/ventilation system improvements and much more. The improvements for our school will be amazing!

Construction is planned to begin in June and is expected to be completed early in the fall of 2021. Our campus is closed to visitors – Please do not enter fenced areas and obey all posted signs.

Scott's office will be relocated to Chávez Elementary School during the summer. Campuses will remain closed, and the schedule for staffing the school office will vary during the summer. Please contact Scott's office at 503-399-3302 for information about summer office hours.
