The District recognizes the importance of providing students with positive, productive educational experiences, and the need to protect students from harmful material on the Internet. The District will take the necessary and prudent steps to comply with the Federal Children’s Internet Protection Act as well as District policies and procedures, to prevent access to inappropriate material via the Internet. While Internet Filtering technology makes it more difficult for inappropriate material to be accessed, every user must take responsibility for his or her use of the Internet and actively avoid accessing inappropriate materials. It is the responsibility of staff to engage students in the appropriate use of technology and to have discussions with students on what is appropriate when situations arise.

1. Internet filtering rules will comply with Federal and State laws.
2. All internet access from the District network will filtered, logged, and when necessary, monitored.
3. Websites that fall into the following categories are blocked: Adult and Mature Content, Pornography, Drugs, Violence, Gambling, Peer to Peer Technologies, Illegal or Questionable, and Security Risks.
4. The Superintendent or designee may approve exemptions from web filtering for specific employees based upon their job responsibilities.
5. All internet use by staff is subject to district policy HUM-A003 Use of Computer, Mobile Device, Network, Email, and Internet Connections Policy
6. All internet use by students is subject to district policy INS-A004 Acceptable Use of Electronic Resources
