What to know about Hybrid Learning

Salem-Keizer Public Schools is currently planning to transition to a hybrid-learning model starting in early March for students in grades K-1, adding additional grades in the following weeks. In hybrid learning, students alternate coming to school two days a week and attending school online two days a week. Health and safety are top priorities for the district as we return to in-person learning.

RETURN TO SCHOOL BUILDINGS: GRADES K-1/SPECIAL PROGRAMS, HYBRID LEARNING

The first week of hybrid learning for students in **kindergarten** and **first grade** will be the week of **March 2**. Students will either attend school in-person on Tuesdays and Thursdays or on Wednesdays and Fridays. On the alternate days, students will attend school online. Mondays are reserved for student supports and outreach.

Students who participate in **elementary multi-grade special programs** will also transition to hybrid learning on **March 2**. These programs include Emotional Growth Centers (EGCs), developmental kindergarten, first and second grade classrooms, Developmental Learning Centers (DLCs), Life Skills Classrooms (LSCs), Social Communication Intervention Program (SCIP) and Educational Resource Centers (ERCs).

RETURN TO SCHOOL BUILDINGS: GRADES 4-5, HYBRID LEARNING

District goal for **fourth grade** and **fifth grade** to begin hybrid learning the week of **March 16**.

EXPANDED LIMITED-IN PERSON INSTRUCTION

For secondary students, the district will expand limited in-person instruction access with a focus on high school seniors who need additional support to graduate. Additional information for plans to bring secondary students back into school buildings for hybrid learning will be shared in the coming weeks.
