Salem-Keizer Public Schools cuts the ribbon on bond-funded improvements at McKay High School

In May 2018, voters approved a \$619.7 million bond to fund improvements for Salem-Keizer schools

SALEM, Ore. – Last week, supporters of McKay High School, including local officials, school board members, community supporters and school staff, gathered for a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate bond-funded improvements at McKay High School.

With a total project budget of nearly \$64 million, McKay boasts 11 new science labs, four new general education classrooms, two expanded career and technical education (CTE) program spaces, one new CTE program space, seismic improvements, safety and security improvements and more.

“I’m grateful to the Salem-Keizer community for investing in the future of our students,” said McKay Principal Ranae Quiring. “Improvements to the CTE program spaces, science labs, music spaces, special education program spaces, commons and much more will enhance the learning environment and support student success for many years.”
