Responding to the Ice Storm

- Approximately 140,000 homes and businesses without power and/or internet
- School canceled for the entire week; will need to make calendar adjustments
- Community Resource Specialists, CSOC's, McKinney Vento Advocates, Migrant Education Advocates, all reached out to families to offer supports
- Teachers responded in a variety of ways: impromptu food boxes, checking in on families, distributing clothing, books, blankets
- Sodexo and Food Service quickly retooled to provide grab-and-go lunches on Thursday/Friday



In-Person Learning/Hybrid - Elementary

- 2/22 All elementary staff reported to work in schools
- 3/2 Grades K-1 and elementary self-contained start hybrid
- 3/9 Grades 2-3 start hybrid
- 3/16 Grades 4-5 start hybrid
- 3/22-26 Spring Break
- 3/30 K-5 hybrid resumes



Families Who Want Remote Learning Option

1. If a family requests to **remain in remote learning**, the family should contact their resident school administrator.
2. The building administrator will discuss options with the family, answer any questions, and if necessary submit a **Request to Stay in Remote Learning**.
3. Families will be notified that their student will be enrolled in a remote learning classroom with an EDGE or district-assigned teacher.
4. Students begin in their new classrooms when their grade level transitions to hybrid learning.

Secondary Planning

- District facilities continuing to evaluate room capacity for hybrid model
- 2-day hybrid model preferred
- Applied learning remains an option if capacity issues restrict hybrid model
- April 13 target date for hybrid instruction to begin
- Communication plan is in development



OSAA Updates

- SKPS submitted and met requirements for opting in to allow **outdoor contact sports beginning Feb. 22.**
- Sports permitted to begin include **full-contact football, cross country, and soccer.**
- Practices for Season 1 begin Feb. 22 with competition scheduled for the week of March 1.
- News as of today (Feb. 23) - Marion and Polk counties will go from extreme risk to high risk on Feb. 26, which allows us to begin volleyball practice (indoor limit of 50).
- **No spectators permitted** at contests due to county high-risk status.
