- Sense of Student Belonging
- Attendance Rates at Each Level
- Major Discipline Incidents at Schools
- Suspensions and Expulsions



Overview of Ongoing Monitoring Reports

- Purpose is to provide ongoing data related to the safety and well-being of our students.
- Data will be included as a monthly report, but not given as a formal presentation each month. This will be in addition to the regular Key Performance Indicator reports.
- Goal for this meeting is for members to reach agreement on a consistent data reporting schedule and structure.



Suggested Reporting Categories

- Suspension/Expulsion rates at each level
- Counseling Referrals to mental health providers in schools
- Major Discipline Incidents
 - Weapons in schools
 - Major aggressive behaviors (assault, extreme behaviors)
- Referrals from SKPS Safety & Risk Management Systems
 - Suicide Risk Assessments
 - Threat Assessments
 - Fire Starting
 - Sexual Incident Response



Data Gap: Civil Rights Data Collection

- Related to access and barriers to preK-12 educational opportunity. Includes multiple data points that change every two years.
- **Collections occur every two years.** Next collection is in winter 2022 for school year 20-21. Collection cycle has been interrupted due to COVID-19.
- **Two data points required** in the current collection, *Referrals to Law Enforcement* and *School-Related Arrests*, have not been traditionally collected by SKPS.
- To remedy this, two teams have been formed:
 - **Technical workgroup** to create the needed data tracking and reporting systems.
 - **Functional workgroup** to define use of the *Referrals to Law Enforcement* and *School-Related Arrests* dispositions and create a training plan.
