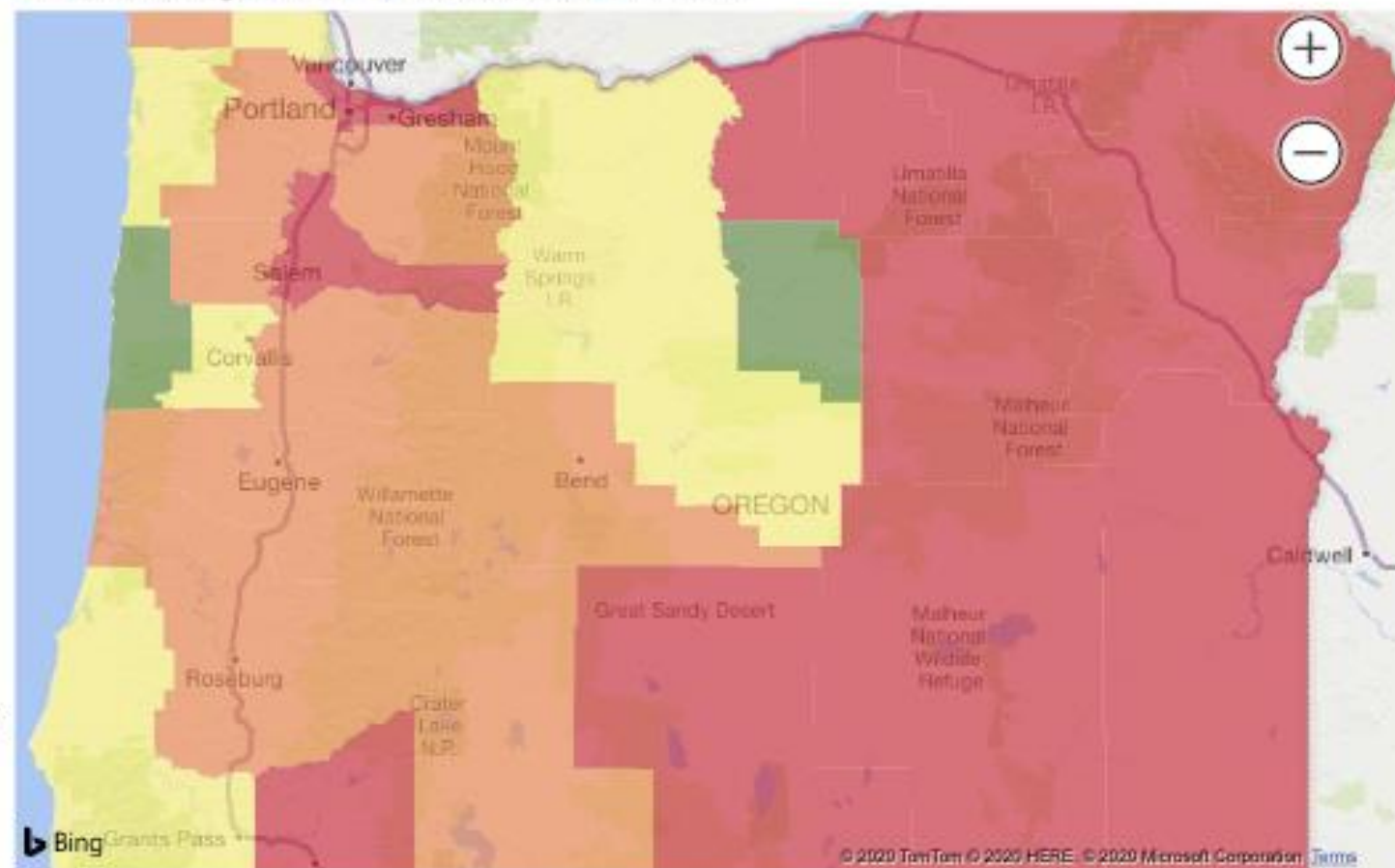

COVID Metrics Update

All students participate in distance learning. Limited In-Person Instruction is permitted for specific groups of students to support success in distance learning. Teachers and staff have access to school buildings following physical distance guidelines and safety protocols.

Decision Criteria:

- Marion County* case rate more than 100 cases per 100,000 over the previous two-week period.
- Marion County test positivity more than 8.0%

**Marion County rates are used since SKPS has schools in both Polk and Marion Counties*

Two-Week Pause: ODE Guidance

- Countywide "pause" does not directly impact school programming or operations
- Limited in-person instruction can continue following the Ready Schools Safe Learners guidelines
- At this point, OSAA activities can continue following OHA and ODE guidelines; fewer than 50 people in shared spaces
- Encouraged to maintain strong partnerships with local public health authorities for localized decision-making

Limited In-person Instruction

- Started with pilot programs in a handful of schools with goal of having limited in-person groups at all schools
- Currently have 42 schools offering programs
- Schools are doing a great job following safety protocols
- Initial evidence is showing that even limited in-person contact can make a significant difference
- Plan to continue to offer LIPI supports, but **not greatly expand** the number of students at each location
